Executive Summary

Over the summer of 2024, Travel Drumheller, as part of the implementation of the communities' Destination Development Plan, completed a Summer Visitor Survey. The purpose of the survey was to evolve the understanding of visitors to the Drumheller region and create a profile of our visitors. This information can be used to inform decisions and programs undertaken by businesses, organizations and governments across the region. The survey results can be used to develop itineraries, refine marketing and attract investment that supports and expands tourism.

A total of 3,392 responses were provided by visitors through outreach at over 80 locations across the region. These responses were focused on the Starter Survey, made up of the three most useful questions, as identified by the working group. The working group, made up of representatives from the region's largest attractions, informed the creation of the survey. Of these respondents, 1,269 completed the Follow Up Survey. The Follow Up Survey consisted of 27 questions that provided more information on visitors' trip planning, logistics and experience. The results were consolidated, cleaned and analyzed by Travel Drumheller, with support from McSweeney & Associates. The results provided new insights, along with affirming assumptions about visitors. For example:

- The Drumheller region is predominately a day trip destination, with 55% of respondents coming only for a day. Day trippers are most likely to plan spur of the moment.
- Most respondents indicated they planned their trip one to six months in advance.
- Respondents came for a variety of attractions/experiences, with the Royal Tyrrell Museum being the top attraction drawing visitors. 36% of respondents indicated that the Royal Tyrrell Museum brought them to the region.
- The morning is when 77% of day trip respondents arrived to the Drumheller region, with most arriving at 11:00am and 10:00am.
- The respondents average spend on a typical day was \$462, with a median spend of \$267. When considered relative to their time spent in Drumheller, the typical daily spend varies between \$330 to \$1,043.

Businesses, organizations and governments across the region are invited to explore the results and their application through an in-person interactive workshop following the release of the summary report.



Purpose

The goal of the Summer Visitor Survey was to create a visitor profile, providing a better understanding of the behaviors of visitors to the Drumheller region and serve as a benchmark for the future.. This understanding can be used by businesses, organizations and governments across the region with an interest in growing and thriving through tourism.

The survey is one of six actions underway in 2024 to implement the Destination Development Plan, supported by Travel Drumheller.

The Survey

The Summer Visitor Survey was developed by Travel Drumheller, with a working group of representatives from large attractions in the Drumheller region, that included the Atlas Coal Mine, Badlands Amphitheatre, Rosebud Theatre, Royal Tyrrell Museum of Palaeontology, World's Largest Dinosaur / Visitor Information Centre.

The survey, made up of 30 questions, was broken into two components.

- 1. Starter Survey The Starter Survey was limited to the first 3 questions, considered to be the most useful by the working group. The goal was to get 3,000 responses to the Starter Survey.
- 2.Follow Up Survey The Follow Up Survey included the remaining 27 questions, providing a more detailed view of the visitors trips.

A pilot of the Starter Survey questions was completed during the Jurassic Jamboree event, held April 27, 2024. The learnings from the pilot resulted in the expansion of question 3 to allow for the selection of three options, rather than only one. Respondents who opted-in for the Follow Up Survey were part of the summer data collection.



Collecting Responses

Responses to the survey were collected from visitors between May 17 and September 9, 2024. Visitors were asked to complete the survey using a number of techniques, including:

- 1.A-frames, posters and stickers with QR codes posted at businesses and locations throughout the region
- 2. Post-visit emails or e-newsletters
- 3. In-person through staff at the Visitor Information Centre or Travel Drumheller ambassadors.

Over 80 different businesses, organizations and locations participated in the collection of survey responses. Most businesses posted QR codes. Post-visit emails or e-newsletters were used by the Royal Tyrrell Museum, Bikes and Bites, Rosebud Theatre and the Badlands Amphitheatre.

All the listed techniques enabled visitors to complete the Starter Survey, with the option to opt-in or continue with the Follow Up Survey.

Visitors were encouraged to participate in the survey through two incentives:

- 1. Monthly draws for \$20 gift certificates to local restaurants based on completion of the Starter Survey.
- 2.A Winter Weekend Get Away package (valued at \$700) based on completion of the Follow Up Survey.

All respondents had to complete the required survey component, along with optin to the incentive draws and the use of their email.

Thank you to all the businesses and organizations that supported the collection of survey responses from visitors.



The goal of 3,000 responses to the Starter Survey was reached, with a total of 3,392 responses. Over one-third of the respondents completed the Follow Up Survey (1,269 responses). The results were consolidated, cleaned and analyzed by Travel Drumheller, with support from McSweeney & Associates.

The results are one tool that should be used alongside others to help inform decisions, marketing, itineraries and more. When considering the summary of the results shared here, it's important to remember that the responses reflect:

- A snapshot in time
- A portion of the over 500,000+ visitors that come to the Drumheller region
- The success of different techniques and locations in getting visitors to complete the surveys

For example, the techniques used at the Royal Tyrrell Museum, Badlands Amphitheatre and Visitor Information Centre were most successful in gaining visitor responses.

For each question the sample size is listed. The sample size reflects the number of responses specific to that question. The sample size can vary from the total survey responses if someone skipped a question or the questions allows for more than one response. Consider the size of the sample when reflecting on the results, as too small a sample size can easily be skewed with a few responses.


The graphs provide a quick view of the results. For questions with more response options, the graphs may be limited to the top results or options grouped.

Throughout you will find additional information inserted that explores the relationship between questions. The relationship information shared focuses on the key conclusions.

The last question provided an opportunity for open-ended feedback. A sampling of feedback is included as part of questions on the same topic (eg. accommodations). When reflecting on the open-ended feedback look for trends or recurring comments, while at the same time considering the one-off comments. Consider how the comments may inform specific programs, businesses or approaches.




Q1. How long was your stay in Drumheller?



Out of the 3,336 responses, most came for a day trip (55%), with overnight stays focused on 1-2 nights.

Q2. How far in advance was your trip to Drumheller planned?




Spur of the moment

Out of the 3,336 responses, most planned their trip between one to six months in advance (33%). Many respondents planned in a one month or less timeframe.

We can compare the length of stay to how far in advance a trip is planned. A day trip was the most likely to be planned spur of the moment. All other trip lengths were planned one to six months in advance.

Respondents were able to choose up to 3 options from a list of 26 options. The list included Other allowing for attractions/experiences not on the list. The intent was that the option selected as 1 was the most important attraction/experience that brought them to the region.

Out of 3,209 responses the attractions/experiences that were most commonly selected as 1, 2 and 3 are listed in the table above

To view all the reponses together a weight was applied to each response. Those selected in first place, got 3 points, second place, got 2 points, and third place, got 1 point. With the 3,209 responses this resulted in a total of 16,634 points. Not all respondents made three selections. The weighted attractions/experiences that brought respondents to the Drumheller region are listed in the table.

The Dinosaur and Badlands options were not originally included in the survey, they were pulled out from the Other category. Options shown a 0% are a result of low points and rounding.

Respondents came to the region for a wide range of attractions/experiences.

36% of respondents indicated that the Royal Tyrrell Museum brought them here.

Q4. In one word, describe the inspiration for your trip to Drumheller?




The word cloud represents the top 50 words used by respondents to describe the inspiration for their trip to Drumheller. Out of 1,106 most common responses were versions of or related to dinosaurs (ie. dino, fossils, specific dinosaurs, palaeontology, etc) and versions of family (ie. children, kids, family, etc). There were over 200 different responses including adjectives (eg. Delightful), activities (eg. Theatre), and interests (eg. Geology).

(eg. Geology). It's a great place to visit with smaller children. They love the dinosaurs and we get family time camping."




Q5. Where do you live?



Most of the 1,006 respondents were from Alberta (67%). Those who selected Drumheller & Area are considered locals and would have been directed out of the Follow-Up survey after this question.


Out of the 671 from Alberta, most respondents were from Calgary (40%) and Edmonton (19%). Cochrane, Airdrie, Red Deer and Sherwood Park were far less (2-3%, 11-17 respondents) representing the next most common location where respondents were visiting from. Nearly 100 different Alberta locations were listed by the respondents.






Out of 272 respondents from other locations within Canada, most were from British Columbia (39.7%).

Out of the 50 respondents from outside of Canada, most were from the United States (60.4%).




Q6. What cateogory(ies) best describe who you travelled to Drumheller with?




Of the 993 respondents, many came with their spouse/partner (70%) and their children (61%).

Of the 991 respondenses the top three group sizes were a group of four (25%), two (22%) or three (18%). Solo travelers made up the smallest portion of respondents (2%).

Q8. How many people in your group fall into each age category?




Of the 3,631 respondents the top three age ranges were children (19 years and under) (35%), age 40-49 (18%) and age 30-39 (17%). The remaining one-third of respondents were within the other age ranges.

Each group would have included multiple people, thus the increase in respondents relative to Q7.




Q9. Complete the sentence, Drumheller was:



Of the 992 responses, two thirds (67%) indicated that Drumheller was the main destination of their trip.




Q10. What sources of information did you use to plan your Drumheller trip prior to arriving?



Of the 2,340 responses, the most common sources of information prior to arrival were previous personal experience (25%), the website of an activity/attraction in Drumheller (21%) and friends and relatives (15%). Options with fewer than 50 responses are not included in the graph.

The additional options available included: Exploration Guide, Travel book/brochure, None and Other. Other provided by respondents included Google search/maps and Reddit.

Q11. What sources of information did you use to plan your Drumheller trip while you were here?




Out of the 1,803 responses, the most common sources of information while in the region were previous personal experience (25%), the website of an activity/attraction in Drumheller (19%) and friends and relatives (10%).

Options with fewer than 50 responses are not included in the graph. The additional options available included: Travel book/brochure, Travel Alberta, Blog/article/brochure, Travel booking website and Other. Other provided by respondents included Google search/maps and other apps.

We were in Alberta for other reasons and have a dinosaur obsessed son (so we made sure to go to the museum). I didn't realize how many other things there were around. Q12. How many times have you been to Drumheller?




Of the 994 responses, most respondents indicate they have been to Drumheller 2-5 times (45%).

The number of times a respondent has been to Drumheller was compared to the attractions they visited (Q19). The World's Largest Dinosaur and the Hoodoos are less likely to be visited by frequent visitors.




Q13. What form of transportation did you use to get to Drumheller?



Of the 994 responses, personal vehicles (85%) were the most common transportation used to get to the region. Recreational Vehicles (RV) included any camping enabled vehicles. The Other category in the graph groups EV vehicle, Bus – independent traveller, and Other. No respondents selected the option Airplane to the Drumheller Airport.

Q14. What type of accommodation(s) did you stay in while visiting Drumheller?




Of the 596 responses that indicated they stayed beyond a day trip, the most popular choices for accommodations were a hotel/motel (53%) and a campground (23%). The 0% is a result of low response and rounding.

The feedback (Q30 / Appendix A) provides a wide variety of comments on the quality and price of accommodation available in the Drumheller region. The desired type of visitor to the region should be taken into account when reviewing the comments.

Q15. How did you book your accommodations?



Of the 559 responses, most bookings were made directly with the accommodation (online, phone or in-person) (57%).




Q16. Did you have the flexibility to extend your Drumheller trip if you wanted to?



Of the 858 responses, 45% of respondents had the option to extend their trip.



Q17. How many nights was your trip as a whole?




Of the 552 responses, most respondents total trip was limited to 1 to 2 nights (51%). The respondents selected the number of nights stayed from none to more than 15 nights. Day trip, or 0 night stays, were an additional 306 responses.

For most (74% of 295 responses) respondents their time in Drumheller matched their total trip length (Q1 compared to Q17).




Q18. For your day trip, what time did you arrive in Drumheller?



Respondents (399) who came for a day trip, mostly (77%) arrived in the morning (8:00am to noon). The most popular times to arrive were 11:00am (23%) and 10:00am (19%). Next most popular were 12:00pm/noon (9%), 9:00am (8%), 10:30am (7%) and 9:30am (6%). Afternoon arrival peaked at 2:00pm (5%). Only 5% of respondents arrived in the evening/overnight between 3:00pm and 8:00am.

Q19. What attractions/experiences did you visit during your trip to Drumheller?

Of the 994 responses the most visited attractions/experiences included the Royal Tyrrell Museum (87%), the World's Largest Dinosaur (48%) and the Hoodoos (48%). The graph only shows those attractions/experiences with over 10% response. Respondents were provided with 25 options that additionally included Badlands Amphitheatre / Passion Play, Badlands Historical Centre, Barney's Adventure Park, Cactus Coulee Fun Park, Dinosaur Trail Golf & Country Club, East Coulee School Museum, Farms or Farmers Market, Homestead Museum, Orkney Viewpoint, Rosebud Theatre, Sunny Spot Mini Golf and Corn Maze and Other.


Nine of the attractions were compared to the other attractions, considering the likelihood of those attractions being paired. Comparisons must have a value of +/- 9% to be considered noteworthy. Consideration must be given to the sample size. This comparison showed:

- Respondents that went to the Royal Tyrrell Museum (860 responses) were less likely to visit the World's Largest Dinosaur (-9%) or the Hoodoos (-9%)
- Respondents that went to the Hoodoos (473 responses) were likely to visit the Star Mine Suspension Bridge (9%)
- Respondents that went to the Atlas Coal Mine (123 responses) were likely to go to the East Coulee School Museum (10%) along with many of the free outdoor / natural experiences in the region.
- Respondents that went to the Rosebud Theatre (31 responses) were the least likely (-39%) to pair it with a visit to the Royal Tyrrell Museum.

The attractions/experiences were compared relative to the total trip length (Q17). Comparisons must have a value of +/- 9% to be considered noteworthy. This comparison showed:

- Day trippers (306 responses) are less likely than the overall respondents to visit the World's Largest Dinosaur (-15%), Hoodoos (-11%), Shopping (-10%), Star Mine Suspension Bridge (-10%), Wayne / Last Chance Saloon (-10%), Atlas Coal Mine (-8%) or Camping (-12%)
- Respondents (131 responses) staying for 2 nights are more likely than the overall respondents to visit those same attractions: World's Largest Dinosaur (13%), Hoodoos (10%), Shopping (9%), Dinosaur Trail Loop (9%), Star Mine Suspension Bridge (11%), Wayne / Last Chance Saloon (11%), Atlas Coal Mine (8%) or Camping (18%)


Q20. If you were visiting Drumheller to attend a specific event, what event was it?




Of the 186 responses that indicated they came for an event, the personal and/or family event (37%) was the most popular. The graph only shows those events with at least 5% response. Respondents were provided with the option of 18 recurring summer events, None, and Other.

The Jurassic Jamboree happened in the spring, and this spike reflects the opt-in of the pilot Starter Survey completing the Follow Up Survey.

Q21. How much did the World's Largest Dinosaur factor into your decision to visit Drumheller?




When focused on the 482 respondents who went to the World's Largest Dinosaur (Q19) there is a minor increase in the importance of the World's Largest Dinosaur as a decisionmaking factor, with an average of 2.59. Respondents were asked to provide their response based on a scale of 'not at all important' (1) to 'extremely important' (5). The average of the 994 responses was 2.27, thus the World's Largest Dinosaur was a limited factor to visiting Drumheller. Most respondents indicated it was 'not at all important' (42.4%). Only 51% of the respondents who selected 'extremely important (5)' went to the World's Largest Dinosaur.






Q22. What activities did you participate in during your visit?



Of the 992 responses, the most popular activities were dining out, sightseeing and hiking or walking. Only those activities with more than 5% response are shown on the graph.


Respondents were provided with a list of 14 options, including Other. The options provided that didn't get more than 5% include bicycling and river-based activities (such as kayaking, canoeing, floating, the beach). The Museum option was included in the graph as it was a common Other response. Other activities listed by respondents were varied and included fishing, golfing, volunteering, star gazing, exploring and disc golfing.

Q23. How did you book your activities and attractions?



Of the 938 responses, most people booked their activities/attractions ahead of time (51%), followed by during their stay (24%). Not all activities/attractions required bookings or are available to book ahead of time. The respondents showed little use of discount/coupon websites (1%) or travel agency/tour operators (1%).


Q24. What types of food and beverage establishments did you visit while in Drumheller?



Many of the quality food options were closed during our stay. Which was disappointing." "higher quality restaurants would be welcome too much junk food" Of the 1985 responses, Cafe / Coffee Shop (21%), Restaurant (21%), Fast Food / Takeout (18%) and Grocery Store (13%) were the most common food and beverage establishments visited. Respondents had a choice of 10 options, including Other. The responses to Other are shown as: None, Other, Brought Our Own and Attraction Food. Attraction Food includes locations such as the Royal Tyrrell Museum cafeteria and concert concession at the Badlands Amphitheatre.

The feedback (Q30 / Appendix A) provides a wide variety of comments on the quality and availability of restaurants available in the Drumheller region. The hours of operation, quality of food and service were raised by many respondents.

Q25. How much did your group spend on a typical day during your visit to Drumheller in each of the following categories: accommodation, meals, shopping, entertainment, transportation.




Based on 981 responses, the average spent on a typical day was \$462, with a median spend of \$267.

The typical spending was compared to the length of stay in Drumheller (Q1) - graph on the next page. Based on the 611 responses the average spent on a typical day varies between \$330 to \$1,043. The most common group size was 4 people.


The results to Q25 should be viewed with caution as the data is skewed due to the wide range of responses. The difference between the average and median (ie. the number in the middle of the data set) confirms the skewed data. This may be the result of respondents providing their total spend, rather than their typical daily spend. The lowest amount listed in each category ranged from \$1 to \$10 and the highest amounts ranged from \$1,000 to \$5,000.

Q26. How important was each feature in your decision to visit Drumheller?




Respondents were asked to provide their response based on a scale of 'not at all important' (1) to 'extremely important' (5). All responses are consolidated into the top graph.

Of the 994 responses, the features that were most important to deciding to visit Drumheller, based on the average of the responses, were:

- Attractions & Events (3.8),
- Scenic Beauty the Badlands (3.8) an
- the Overall Atmosphere of the Area (3.6)
- Value for Money, Safety and Customer Service (all 3.4).

Shopping (2.1) and Access to Wireless Internet / Wifi (2.3) were least important.

Q27. How was your experience in Drumheller for each feature?

Perception of Importance (Q26) Experience of Feature (Q27)

Respondents were asked to provide their response based on a scale of 'very bad' (1) to 'excellent' (5). Of the 994 responses, the Overall Satisfaction with their experience in Drumheller was good at an average of 4.2 out of 5.

The graph shows the average experience of each feature (Q27) was compared with the respondent's perceptions of importance (Q26).

Overall Satisfaction = 4.2 / 5



Q28: What is the likeliness that you will recommend Drumheller to your family or friends?

The 994 responses to Q28 can be used to calculate a Net Promoter Score (NPS). The NPS is calculated by subtracting the percent of Detractors (scores 0-6) from the overall percent of Promoters (scored 9 and 10). The NPS is 73 (77 % Promoters - 5% of Detractors) which is excellent. The higher the score the more likely respondents will generate positive word-of-mouth and referrals.


Based on the responses in Q19 this high NPS may be more reflective of the Royal Tyrrell Museum, than the Drumheller region as a whole.

The 2023 Resident Sentiment Survey included a NPS of 13% (good), which was higher than the NPS for Alberta as a whole.

The splash pad seemed very slippery and one of my kids slipped and cried. Plus we saw at least 3 other kids do the same thing. After that my kids preferred the fountain for water fun. Can anything be done with the splash pad surface? It's such a a wonderful area for kids to play otherwise and very visually inviting. Loved the dino statues and searching for them.

For kid fun, it would be nice to have playgrounds called out on a few maps. We found two wonderful ones by walking.

Also loved the running/walking paths by the river. Nice to see that improvements/maintenance are being done on them.

Overall a wonderful place to visit. Glad we made it just before the summer rush (we left June 30th). It was relaxed, comfortable and not too crowded. Really loved Black Mountain 91 Roasters. Went there a lot, and just loved seeing them work well with people at something they seemed to enjoy. Plus their food, coffee and tea were excellent!

The splash park is INCREDIBLE slippery. My son slipped, while walking carefully, and hit the back of his head on the cement. We had a lot of other near misses as well. Please fix 92 this. Otherwise, we always love coming to Drumheller to camp, see the Dino's and splash in the paddling Pool

One disappointment is that as visitors for the Labour Day weekend, we were on the cusp of summer and winter hours. I think the businesses should consider extending summer hours to the end of the long weekend because Labour Day really is the end of summer.

We triple checked the hours for the World's Largest Dinosaurs and the website said 9-9 every day. So, we loaded our kids into the car on Monday morning and promised them one last bit of fun before our long drive home. We arrived at 9:10. The hours on the door said it wouldn't open until 10. There were at least 5 other families who had the same confusion. Unfortunately, we just couldn't wait an hour to experience the Dinosaurs so my son cried the first hour of the drive home because he was disappointed. I assume the hours changed with the summer/fall hours and the website was out of date. But it just makes no sense to change the hours when people are visiting for end of summer trips, and leads to confusion and disappointment.

Otherwise, we had a really wonderful trip, and we will definitely be back. But I have learned that websites for local attractions are not to be trusted and we can't deviate from our 93 plan with spur of the moment additions to our day.
