

Dinosaur Trail Loop

Enjoy the most scenic loop in the Drumheller valley with a river crossing on the Bleriot Ferry.

THINGS TO SEE: The Little Church, Horse Thief Canyon, Bleriot Ferry, Orkney Viewpoint, plus highlights from both the Museum and Nacmine routes.

DURATION: 3.5 - 4 hours **DISTANCE:** 50 km

ROUTE: The route is mostly on secondary highways with two big hill climbs and descents and a ferry crossing. Comfort with riding a bike on the road is encouraged. Start with the Museum Route and ride west on 838 at the crosswalk. End with the Nacmine Route, turning off 837 at Red Deer Lane. The start and end are easy riding on pathways and residential roads.

Wayne Route

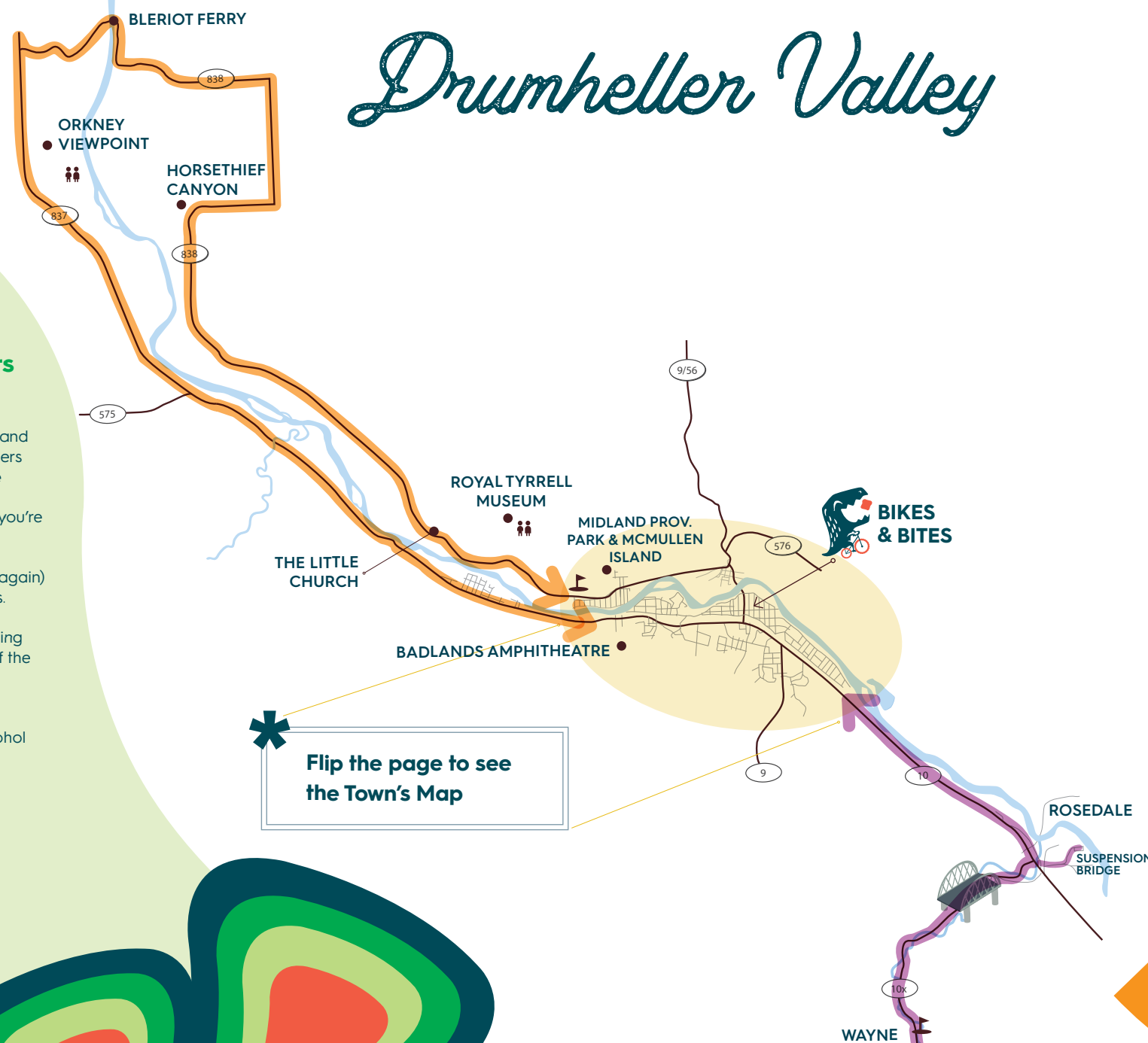
Enjoy the bridges out to the ghost town of Wayne.

THINGS TO SEE: Rosedale, Suspension Bridge, Disc Golf and Last Chance Saloon.

DURATION: 2 - 2.5 hours **DISTANCE:** 30 km

ROUTE: Easy riding along a mix of pathways, residential roads and a secondary highway. The Rails-to-Trails path connecting Drumheller to Rosedale is unpaved. Rosedale to Wayne you are on a quiet and scenic secondary highway (10X) with limited cell phone coverage.

Drumheller Valley



Your bike adventure is enjoyed best when you're respectful of other explorers and travel safely.

- Helmets are encouraged for everyone and are required to be worn by all e-bike riders
- Ride on paths and streets following the safety rules. For example:
 - » Ride on the right side of the road so you're going in the same direction as traffic.
 - » Learn and use hand signals.
 - » Use caution (Look left, right, and left again) and follow road signs at intersections.
- Ride within your skill level and abilities
- Be predictable and observant when riding
- Stay out of private property (ie. most of the hills in the valley)
- Avoid areas under construction and follow detours
- Avoid being under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances (ie. cannabis)

Bikes are a great way to explore the beauty of the Drumheller valley.

Make the best of your bike adventures with leisure routes from Bikes and Bites. Explore Drumheller, its nature, its people, its history, its places, all at your own pace.

Museum Route

Ride through the river valley and badlands to the iconic Royal Tyrrell Museum of Paleontology.

THINGS TO SEE: Homestead Antique Museum, Red Deer River, Rail Bridge, McMullen Island Day Use Area, Midland Provincial Park.

DURATION: 1.5 - 2 hours **DISTANCE:** 16 km

ROUTE: Easy riding plus hills, with a mix of pathways and residential roads. Follow the path west from the Rail Bridge to get to the museum.

Nacmine Route

Ride through town and alongside the edge of the badlands.

THINGS TO SEE: Newcastle Recreation Area & Beach, Badlands Amphitheatre (add-on), Nacmine, Welcome to Drumheller Sign.

DURATION: 1.5 - 2 hours **DISTANCE:** 16 km

ROUTE: Easy riding with a mix of pathways and residential roads.

Rails-to-Trails Loop

Take the iconic railway bridge across the Red Deer River, as you explore the extension of the Rails-to-Trails path.

THINGS TO SEE: Community Murals, Red Deer River, Rail Bridge, Downtown, Wood Carvings.

DURATION: 1.5 - 2 hours **DISTANCE:** 14 km

ROUTE: Easy riding with a mix of pathways and residential roads.

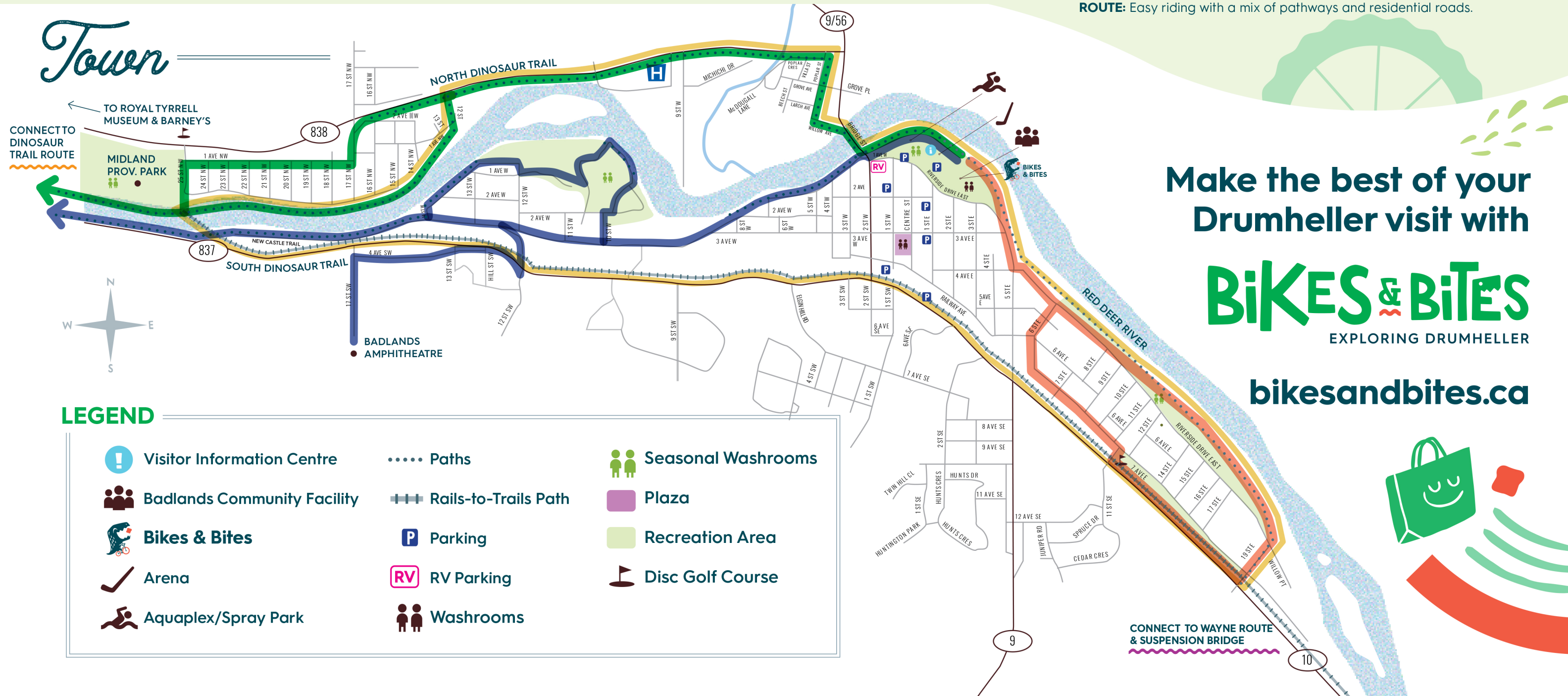
Riverside Loop

Enjoy a ride alongside the Red Deer River and a section of the Rails-to-Trails path.

THINGS TO SEE: Riverside Park, Wood Carvings, Disc Golf.

DURATION: 30 min - 1 hour **DISTANCE:** 6 km

ROUTE: Easy riding with a mix of pathways and residential roads.
