

DRUMHELLER COVID-19 MASK BYLAW 20.20 FAQ

In response to the increasing rate of COVID-19 infections throughout the province and community the Town of Drumheller has declared a local state of emergency and implemented a mandatory mask bylaw. These measures are aimed at increasing public safety while taking proactive steps in the fight against the virus.

1) WHEN AM I REQUIRED TO WEAR A MASK?

At all times when in an indoor public space, workplace, or public vehicle where other people are present unless:

- a person is a child under the age of 2, or a child under the age of 5 who refuses to wear one and cannot be persuaded to
- a person has a medical condition that inhibits their ability to wear a mask
- a person is actively engaging in food or drink consumption, receiving or providing services that require the removal of a mask, or is actively engaging in physical activity

2) DO I HAVE TO WEAR A MASK AT WORK?

Yes, unless

- you are working in an area designated for you where public access is restricted such as an office, or
- you are behind a physical barrier separating you from the public

3) HOW WILL PEOPLE KNOW THEY HAVE TO WEAR A MASK?

All indoor public spaces must display visible signage at the entrance of the establishment that indicates mask bylaw is in place

4) CAN I BE FINED FOR NOT WEARING A MASK?

Yes,

- a person can be fined \$100 for not wearing a mask, and
- a business or establishment can be fined \$200 for not displaying mandatory signage
