Regional Tours

THE PROVINCIAL (127 KM)

This quick route can take as long or short as you like. Stop and take in an Alberta Prairie Steam Train Tour or have a rest at Big Knife Provincial Park. Do a quick detour towards Battle River or just aim towards Donalda where you can check out it's coulee and Lamp Museum. Yes, that's correct, there is a Lamp museum, and this town is also home of the World's Largest Lamp. You can check that off your bucket list.

THE GREAT LAKE LOOP (264 KM)

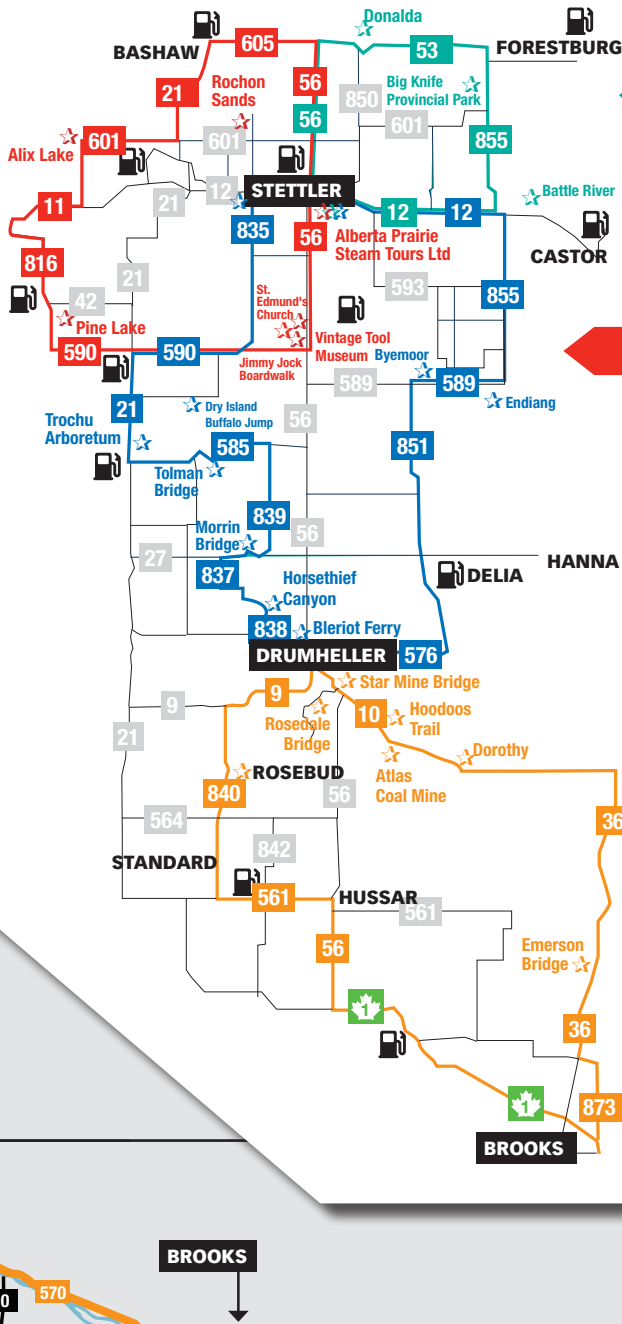
Head west of Stettler for a relaxing ride and take in some beautiful local lakes. Check out the Alberta Prairie Steam Train Tours or soak in Rochon Sands. Want to take in some history? Make sure to stop by Big Valley to check out their Tool Museum, the Jimmy Jock Boardwalk and take a peek at the St. Edmund's Church before heading back towards Stettler. Refuel with a good meal and an even better sleep.

BRIDGING THE GAP (378 KM)

If you are starting in Drumheller, be sure to start at the Bleriot Ferry, then head northwest and stop at The Little Church on your way towards Horsethief Canyon. Enjoy the winding corners that speckle the badland landscape until you approach the stunning Morrin bridge. Take a break for some great photos, then continue on towards Toleman. Check out Dry Island Buffalo Jump provincial park then stop for a drink at the Trochu Arboretum. Swing through Stettler, have a bite to eat then continue towards the charming hamlets of Byemoor and Endiang. This route is guaranteed to be a memorable one.

BIG SKY ROUTE (334 KM)

This makes a great short day ride going through the Alberta Badlands - a desert-like area where many pre-historic bone-beds have been found. Be sure to stop in Drumheller to check out a few of their many attractions. Another great part of this ride? Taking in the hoodoos. If time allows, take a slight detour onto 10X towards Wayne. Visit the Last Chance saloon or carry on to Highway 10 towards Dorothy... You're not in Kansas anymore... about 35 km south east of Drumheller resides this tiny hamlet – population of six. This road is very special—built on top of an abandoned rail bed this strip of two lane blacktop is pretty well the best road in the area. Long easy sweepers make it a great ride and the scenery is some of the best in the Valley. Continue on through Brooks and if time allows, do a slight detour towards Kinbrook Island Park or head farther east towards the Dinosaur Provincial Park that is near Patricia. Once you have taken in all of the sights, loop back and enjoy the small town of Rosebud before arriving back in Drumheller.

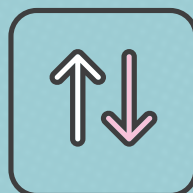
But...if you're feeling unwell, please stay home. Refer to Alberta Health Services' guidelines for current regulations on traveling.



Masks are **mandatory** within all indoor public spaces.



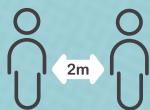
Social gatherings are not permitted anywhere indoors (*restaurants/hotels etc.*) with anyone other than your immediate household.

From the relaxed walker to the friendly competitor, Drumheller has something for everyone. Here are a few ideas to get you motivated...

ACCESSIBLE ADVENTURE



Wander Downtown

LAID BACK

What's better than a leisurely stroll in downtown Drumheller? There are shops to peruse, cafes and restaurants to dine in, and dinosaurs to discover. Places like Black Mountain Roasterie, Au Croque Monsieur, and The Spirit Within even have charming little outdoor patios to enjoy your coffee or a cup of tea on. The Plaza, just behind the Napier Theatre, features live music and events during the summer. During the winter, you can feel the warmth of community spirit with events like Festival of Lights. Catch a Dragon's hockey game at the arena just North of downtown or visit the World's Largest Dinosaur.

E-bike Rentals

LOW KEY

Rent an e-bike from Red Deer River Adventures. It's a low key way to experience the full potential of the Valley's landscape and points of interest. Pack some water, a hat, and sunscreen in a backpack and ride out to the Royal Tyrrell Museum by way of the trails that meander in and around the hills. Or go east and venture out to Rosedale for some ice cream at Asteroid, a neat little castle just along the main road.

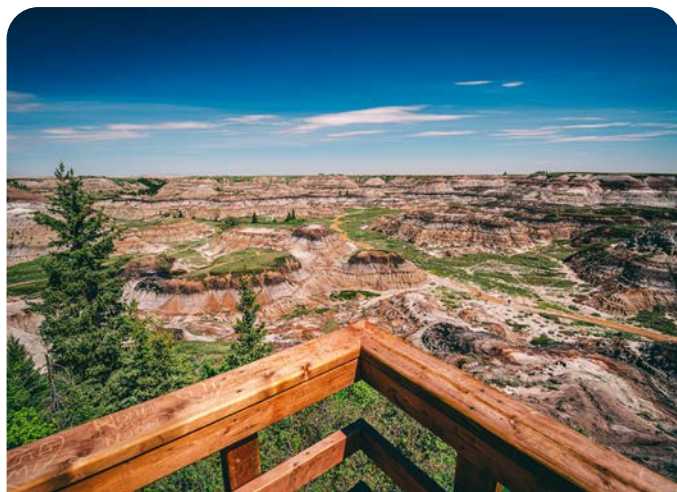

The whole family can cruise along with relative ease in the summer, while Fat bike e-bike rentals are available in the winter.

THE HEART OF THE *Valley*

During the wintertime, the town of Drumheller may appear to get a little quieter, especially when the snow flies. But if you take a walk down Centre Street on a day when the Drumheller Dragons play at the Drumheller Memorial Arena you'll see the opposite is true.

The Dragons, who are part of the Alberta Junior Hockey League (AJHL), played their inaugural season at the Drumheller Memorial Arena in 2003. Since then, the Junior A team, which consists of student-athletes between 16 and 20 years old from all over Alberta, has become a linchpin for fostering community in the valley.

During the season, which runs from late August to February, ardent fans from around the valley and beyond (and often wearing the Dragons' signature orange jersey colour) fill the town's restaurants, cafés and hotels celebrating victories or consoling each other following a defeat. "Before games, because we do have such a fan base in the community, the game nights are super noticeable," says Dustin Edwards, team manager for the Dragons and an employee with Canalta, which operates three hotels in town.

"The Canalta Jurassic is a home-away-from-home for the families of players [both of the Dragons and opposing teams], and a lot of them spend time there or at the Ramada and SureStay as well." Edwards, who is from Drumheller, says the town has enthusiastically embraced the team as its own: staff at Black Mountain Roasters look forward to serving a returning customer base made up of families of players; Yavis family restaurant is a common locale for post-game victory celebrations.

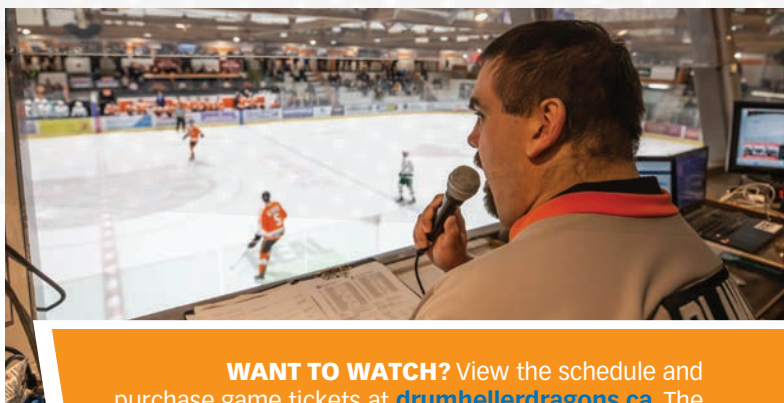
In addition, downtown microbrewery Valley Brewing sells its beer at the arena during games and has even re-branded one of its popular beers, the Capstone Pilsner, as the "Power Play Pilsner" and decorated it with the Dragons' logo. "It's the same beer, but it just tastes better in this [re-branded] can," jokes Nick Sereda, co-owner and manager of Valley Brewing. "It's our way of showing support for the team, and it's also kind of cool that the Dragons are something the whole community can get behind." On an average game night during the season, Dragons games are packed. In a town of roughly 10,000 people, between 800 to 1,000 fans fill the arena. Many in the crowd are family members of the players who have made the trek into Drumheller from surrounding central Alberta communities and beyond. Regardless of where fans hail from, the fast and exciting games bring everyone together.

This is high-level hockey, and often, when players leave the Dragons, they go on to earn hockey scholarships at universities and Ivy League schools. "It gives people something to do in the wintertime. It also gives people something to cheer about," says Jason Blanke, a local radio host in Drumheller and the home announcer for Dragons games at Memorial Arena. "When the Dragons score [in a regular-season game], you can hear it outside the rink.

When the Dragons score in the playoffs, you can hear it three blocks away," he says. Blanke, a hockey super-fan himself, has volunteered with the team for many years and says the sport is taken very seriously in Drumheller. "When the team competes, the fans are right beside them." Not only do the games energize the town during a slower season for local business, but they also offer an opportunity for people to gather and connect despite below-zero temperatures. "I think the community is proud that this team is here, they're proud of the players that come here, and they're proud of what the players accomplish coming through this program," says Blanke.

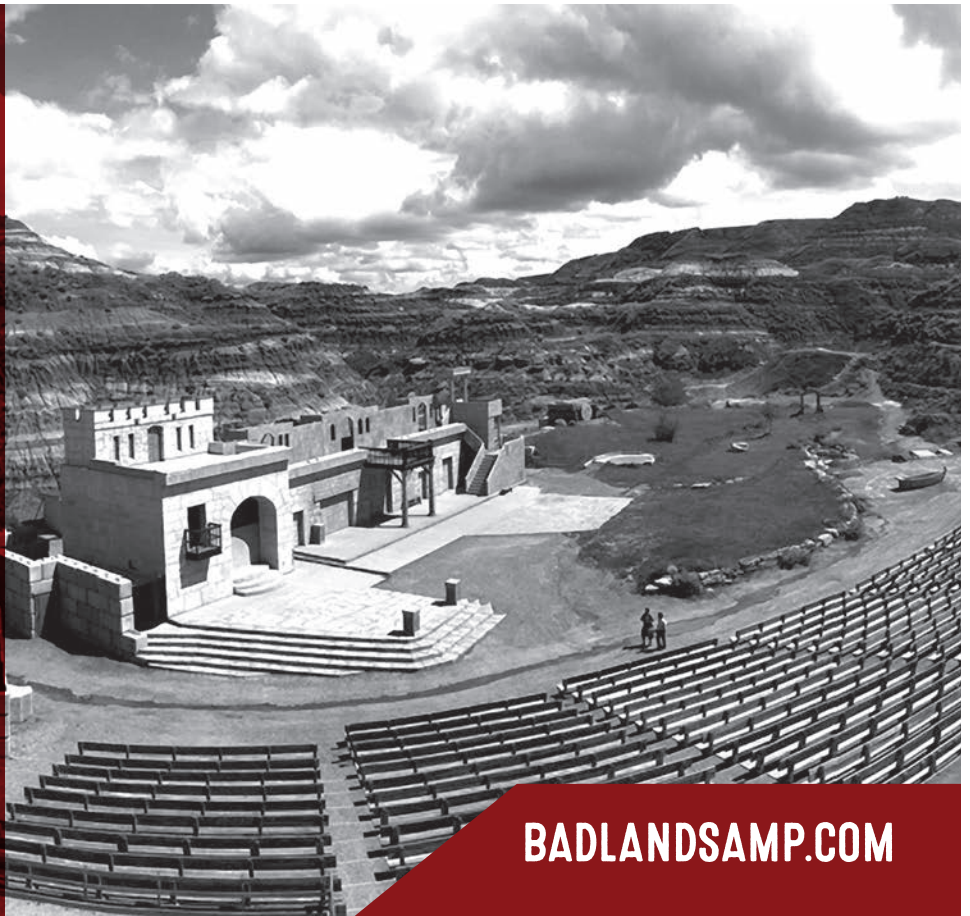

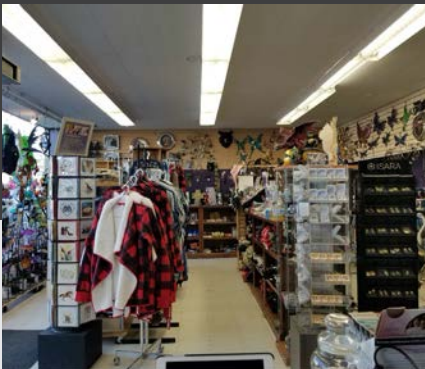

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Flora & Fauna

Millions of years ago the Drumheller Valley was home to some awe-inspiring plants and animals. Today, the area—which is part of the Grassland Natural Region—continues to teem with beautiful and unique wildlife. Here are just a few of the plants and animals you may come across during your next Drumheller adventure.

> **WESTERN SMALL-FOOTED BAT**

Small, with black ears and light brown fur, this bat uses the banks of the badlands for summer roosting and deep crevices for hibernating.

> **PLAINS PRICKLY-PEAR CACTUS**

This native cactus grows in spreading clumps in ridges and slopes. Look for spiky green pads with bright yellow blooms.



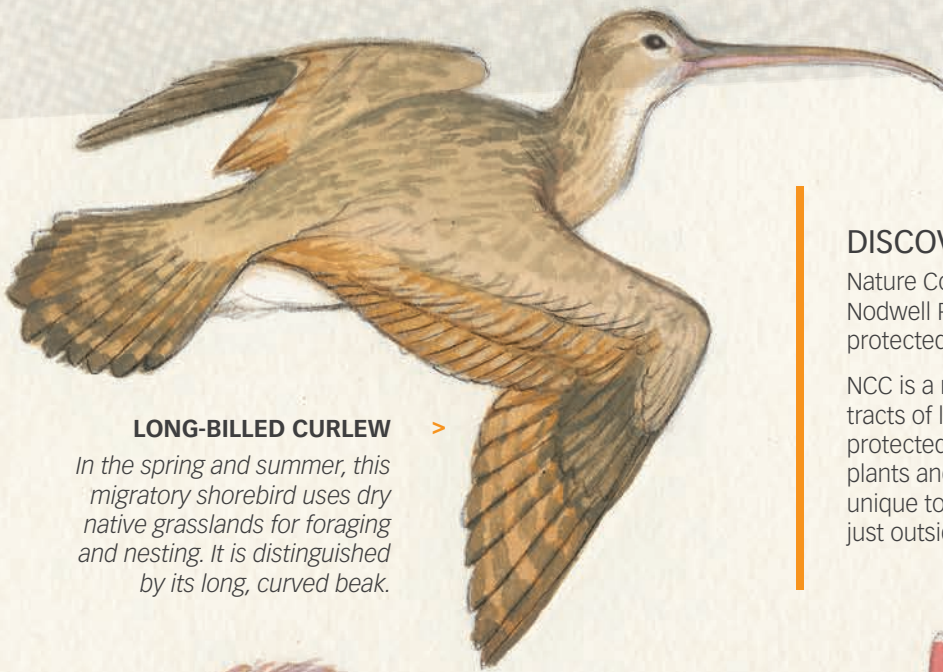

BULLSNAKE

One of the largest Canadian snakes, this non-venomous reptile can grow up to two metres long. It is typically yellowish brown or creamy with dark spots.



LONG-BILLED CURLEW

In the spring and summer, this migratory shorebird uses dry native grasslands for foraging and nesting. It is distinguished by its long, curved beak.

DISCOVER MORE

Nature Conservancy of Canada's (NCC) Nodwell Property is one of more than 4,000 protected nature reserves in Canada.

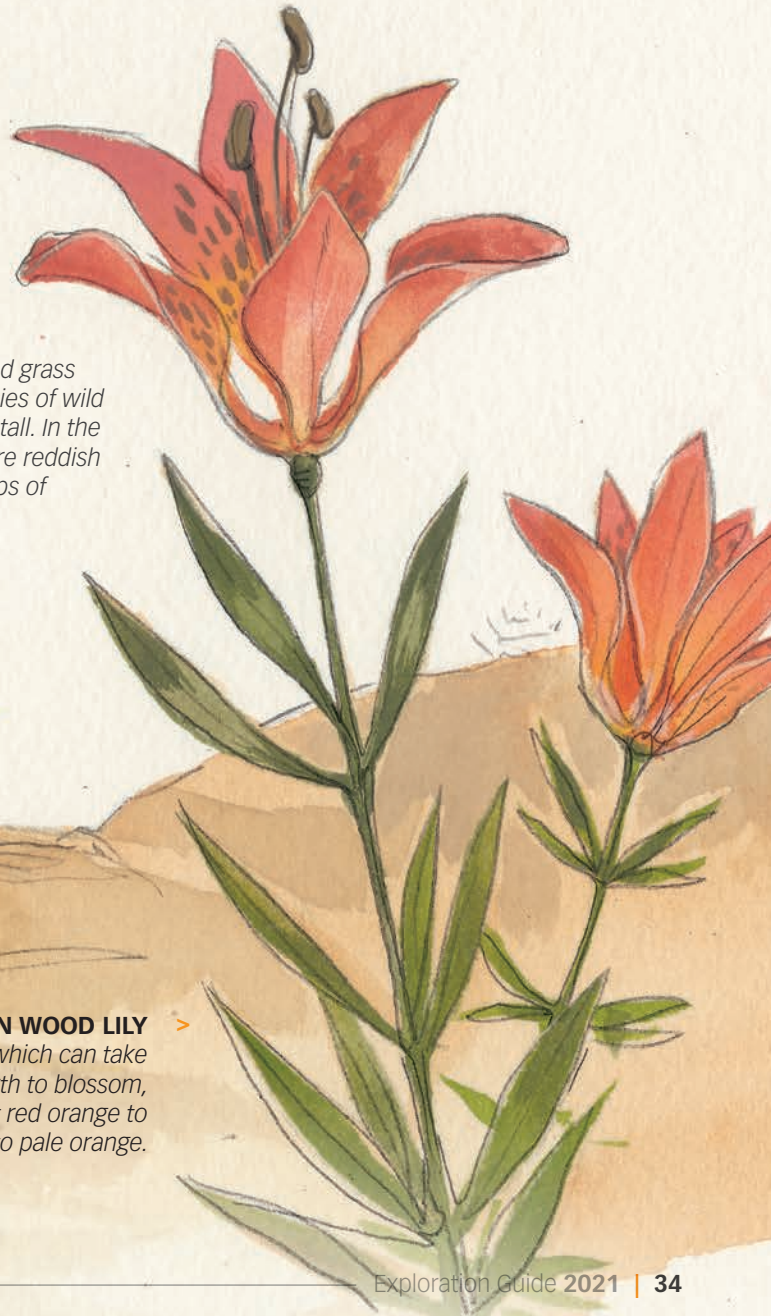
NCC is a not-for-profit that conserves large tracts of land around the country. Nodwell's protected status means that many of the plants and animals you discover here are unique to the area. Find the Nodwell Property just outside Drumheller in Horseshoe Canyon.


SQUIRRELTAIL

This feathery-tipped grass is a perennial species of wild rye and grows 20" tall. In the spring, its spikes are reddish and look like the tips of a squirrel's tail.

WESTERN WOOD LILY

This native plant's bloom, which can take five to seven years from growth to blossom, can vary in colour from bright red orange to reddish magenta to pale orange.

Your first stop should be to the World's Largest Dinosaur. "Tyra," as she's known by her friends far and wide, is 86 feet (25 metres) tall. There are 106 steps to the top, but the view is definitely worth it. She's also attached to the Information Centre, so be sure to grab some maps and brochures to take along with you on your journey.

Unwind at the Rotary Spray Park, right across from the dinosaur. You can cool off or relax at a picnic table nearby. Also nearby is the Drumheller Skatepark, a great place to practice your skills or show off on your bike, skateboard, or rollerblades.

After you shake your wiggles out, take a road trip.

Heading west, you'll find yourself in beautiful Midland Provincial Park. On one side, is the Midland Coal Mine Day Use Area, home of the Midland Coal Interpretive Trail. Just down the road, is McMullen Island, a day use area with paths to venture and nature to discover. It's close to the river, so you could even take a paddle on your canoe or kayak.

If you head out east to Wayne, the whole family can count the 11 bridges you have to cross along the way to get there.



Be sure to take a stop at the Last Chance Saloon which is in the heart of Wayne. Known for their eclectic interior, outdoor patio, mouth watering BBQ and live outdoor music in the summer.



Or find yourself in East Coulee, where you can visit the school museum.

While visiting the Museum, make sure to stop in at the Willow Cafe where you can get some icy cool treats.



Or take a tour at the Atlas Coal Mine National Historic Site. Horseshoe Canyon is another great spot to visit.

Just 17 km southwest of the valley, its hillside layers exude the mystery of the Badlands, where dinosaurs once roamed.

Run away from Tyra for the perfect selfie near the Rotary Spray Park.



There are pathways all throughout the valley. About 18 km stretched along the Red Deer river, and downtown. Rent an e-bike and venture out.

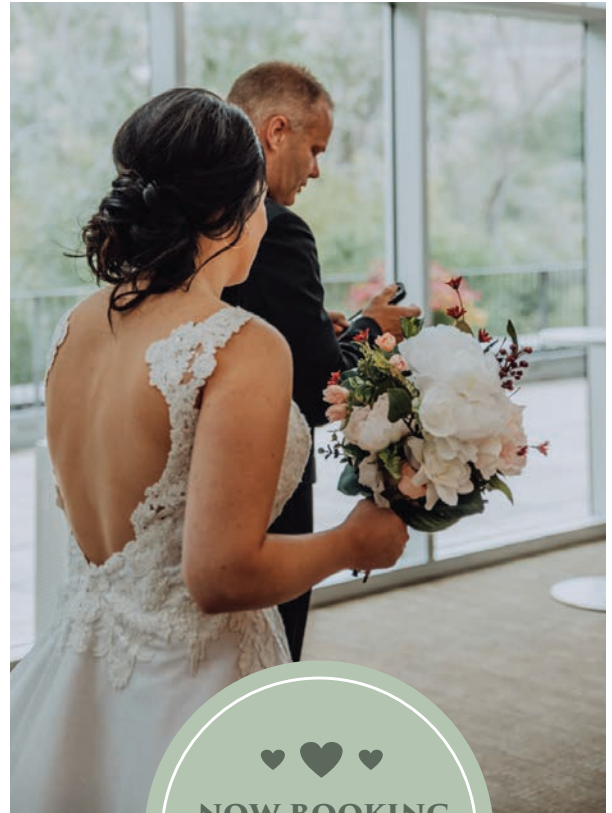
