Drumheller can get extremely busy, so please keep your dogs on a leash in all areas for the safety of you and your pets. This includes Midland Park, Horseshoe Canyon, McMullen Island and the Hoodoos. Stay on the trail when walking your dog. Drumheller has three offleash dog parks for our K-9 lovers. They can be found on Newcastle Trail by the Newcastle Inn, on 7th Avenue East by Drumheller Valley Secondary School and on 1st Ave NW by North Dinosaur Trail. You will also find a small fenced dog park in the Newcastle Recreation area.

#### **BEAT THE HEAT**

HIT THE ROAD

WITH YOUR

Drumheller is hot in the summer, and it doesn't take long to put your pet into a harmful situation when left in a vehicle on a warm day. Public parking often lacks shade and protection from direct sunlight, causing the vehicle's interior temperature to jump from 20°C to 30°C or greater rapidly. Even opening a car window does not provide enough ventilation and reprieve from the heat in the car, (even on cooler days), and heatstroke can happen within 15 mins.

#### Some great alternatives to leaving your dog in the car are:

- Shop at pet-friendly stores where your dog is welcome to browse with you.
- Eat at one of our outdoor cafés where your dog can sit with you.
- Check out Jurassic Bark Pet Resort to take your furry friends into a safe space on those hot days.

Even though you may see an animal in distress in a vehicle, it is strongly recommended that you do not break the glass nor cause damage to the vehicle in question.

Thirteen thousand years ago, the Canadian Badlands were formed from the melting glacial waters of the Laurentide Ice Sheet. Still, the area and many fossils date back even further to 75 million years ago in the Late Cretaceous period.

# So what do you do?

Note the location of the fossil - do not move it. Location is just as important as what you found. Take a picture, use a pen, coin etc., for scale and mark the location on a map with coordinates or GPS.

Once you have collected all the information, it is essential to **report your findings and pictures to the Royal Tyrrell Museum's Head Technician** at tyrrell.fossilreport@gov.ab.ca




